CLEANLINESS MUST BE OUR GREAT CONCERN TOO: IT IS BIBLICAL

This year AAS takes the challenge to begin an entirely new type of ministry. Although how successful our attempt would be is uncertain, our responsibility is to spread awareness, through verbal associates and the coming across of our newsletters, to whomever we may come into contact with. Gospel for Everyone; Toilet for Every Home.

In the Bible, we find in Deuteronomy 23:12-14that our *refuse* (stool) must be dug and covered. The reason being our God, who is a holy God, walks in our midst to deliver us and give us our enemies and he does not like to see unholiness within our camps, houses, and lands. He is not like any other god. *Let's Build Our Lives* written by Daniel E. Fountain, MD made it very clear as follows:

HOW TO BUILD A GOOD LATRINE

1. Where to Build it

*At least 10 meters from the house, but not more than 30 meters.

*At least 50 meters from the nearest spring or well.

2. The Hole must be Deep

*In sandy soil, at least 5 meters deep. * In rocky soil, 3 meters deep.

3. The Floor: A cement slab is very good, can easily move to another latrine.

4. Make an opening 60 centimeters long and 40 centimeters wide.

*Make a wooden or metal cover with a handle on it to cover the hole. This will

keep flies out of the hole.

5. The House: Make it tall enough so a person can stand up inside.

*Leave some space between the walls and the roof. This will let air circulate.

It will let out the bad odors.

Protection Against Erosion
 Plant grass around the latrine to hold the soil.

*Make ditches and dams to turn rain water away from it.

7. Keep It Clean

*Do not throw sticks, cans, or other soil things into the hole. These will fill the hole very quickly.

*Once a week, throw some burning papers or burning grass down the hole.

These will diminish the bad odor and help keep out flies. 8. Replace the Latrine

*When the hole is full, fecal matter comes to 1 meter below the floor, burn the house. Fill the hole with dirt. Plant a fruit tree in this dirt. The old fecal matters will help the tree grow strong and produce much fruit. It is safe to eat this fruit.

The Ministry Department of Asia Antioch Seminary is committed to realizing the motto of the seminary "Seeking and saving the lost at any cost; training the harvesters at all cost". This is being done through sending of our students for various ministries where they get the chance to seek and save which inturn trains them to become effective harvesters. The ministries of the Seminary can be broadly grouped into four categories viz., church planting/nurturing, teaching, caring and evangelism.



We have two house churches, one in Hirimbapur and the other in Soikata. Another house fellowship is being planned in Matiyagaon which is expected to function soon. It is in the area of teaching ministry that most of our students are involved. We have three Sunday schools - one in the campus, one in Hirimbapur and another in Soikata. In places like Sajanpara, Patgaon, Nepali Basti, Matiyagaon and Maligaon where we cannot conduct regular Sunday schools, our students teach the children their school lessons and we organize Vacation Bible School and Pre-Christmas celebration for them every year. A new addition to our list is the ministry of caring. Our students go to Satribari Hospital and Guwahati Medical College where they meet patients, spend time with them, share the love of God and pray for them. We are also looking forward to let the ministry of caring penetrate the prison walls. The process is being initiated and we hope and pray that it will be realized in the near future.

These are the normal Sunday ministerial activities. Apart from the Sunday activities, we also conduct roadside and door to door evangelism from time to time. This evangelism is done on Saturdays where we take our students to the target area, divide them into groups and let loose the message of God's love. In AAS, we find ministry interesting because of its dynamic nature. Taking into consideration the young people's great interest in sports, the Sports Committee and the Ministry Department work together to reach out to youths through sports. We conduct friendly football matches with other clubs from time to time. We hope that through all these ministries, people will come to know the saving act of Christ, receive the divine relationship with God and grow in their spiritual life.
